PUBLIC SAFETY NEWS – Citizens, please review the Town Code online or come to Town Hall and review the hard copy of the Town Code. As a reminder:

8.20.030 Owner to maintain premises. The owner or person in control of any private property shall at all times maintain the premises free of litter; provided, however, that this section shall not prohibit the storage of litter in authorized private receptacles for collection.

9.05.070 *Littering.* It is unlawful for any person to throw or deposit any litter in or upon any street, alley, public grounds, school grounds, church grounds or other property of the town or upon any private property not owned by him or upon the surface of any body of water within the town.

If you have an alleyway behind your residence, it is your responsibility to maintain your half of the alleyway (from your property line to the halfway point of the alley). It shall be mowed, weed whacked and free of litter or debris. Failure to do so can result in a citation by the Police Department.
