2020 Census - Between March 12 and March 20 invitations to participate in the 2020 Census will begin arriving in households throughout the country. The Census counts every person living in the U.S. every 10 years and the information gathered is critical to the future of our communities. It's very

important that <u>everyone</u> be counted. Complete and accurate Census data is vital because:


• It determines the number of seats each state gets in the House of Representatives

• Congressional, state and local district boundaries are redrawn after every Census

• The distribution of more than **\$675 million** in federal funds for schools, hospitals, roads, public works, and other programs is based on population counts

The census invitation will include instructions on how to respond to the 2020 Census online or by phone, as well as a Census ID. If you need assistance responding online or if you do not have internet, Huachuca City Library staff will be able to assist you. They will have dedicated computers available for individuals responding to the census. If for some reason, a person is unable to enter a Census ID, he or she can still respond by providing an address.

Your response has a direct impact on future funds in our state, county and town! For more information stop by the library or go to 2020census.gov. The census is simple, safe and important. Be counted!
