This edition of Sunset City News will focus primarily on the ongoing COVID-19 crisis to include resources and modifications to town operations.

State of Emergency – On March 19, Mayor Wallace issued Proclamation 2020-01 declaring a state of emergency in the town due to the ongoing COVID-19 crisis. Mayor Wallace directed that public access to all town buildings and facilities be closed in the interest of public health. He also directed that all town-scheduled activities creating a gathering of people be cancelled. On March 20, 2020 Mayor Wallace issued a second proclamation based on the news of the first confirmed cased of COVID-19 in Cochise County. He directed the implementation of Governor Doug Ducey's executive order 2020-09 which limits the operation of certain businesses such as restaurants and bars. He also directed the suspension of late fees for utility and landfill accounts, directed public works to immediately suspend all service disconnects and directed the Chief of Police to develop, publicize and implement additional protection measures to are for the public and officers. <u>Census 2020</u> – As we come together to combat the spread of COVID-19, it's never been more critical to respond to the 2020 Census. Your response helps the state plan for situations like this - securing our fair share of resources to meet the needs of Arizonans and representation to advocate for us.

Most of you have already received your invitation to participate in the 2020 Census. According to data available on the 2020 Census website (2020census.gov), Arizona's current response rate is 29.5%. Cochise County's is 26.8% and Huachuca City's is 34.7%. For those of you who have already responded, "Thank you!" If you haven't yet responded, please do so. It is easy to respond online or by phone and only takes a few minutes. If you have questions or need assistance, call the Huachuca City Library at 456-1063. Your response has a direct impact on future funds for our state, county and town. **Be counted!**

Community Food Bank – At this time, the drive-thru distribution of Emergency Food Assistance Program" (TEFAP) food boxes is still scheduled for Fri, Apr 17 in front of the Senior Center from 8 to 9 am. CURRENT TOWN SERVICES	
Town Hall	At this time, Town Hall is closed to the public. Town Hall is still staffed M-F from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM and employees will be answering and conducting business over the phone or by email only. The number to the administration offices is (520) 456-1354.
Library	At this time, the Library is closed to the public. Staff is providing limited curbside checkout (please call for details) and remains available to answer calls Tues - Fri 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM and Saturdays 10:00 AM - 4:00 PM. They can be reached at (520) 456-1063. The Library's wireless remains available 24/7 and can be accessed from the parking lot.
Senior Center	The Senior Center is closed until further notice. Seniors needing information can contact the Library Tues - Fri 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM and Saturdays 10:00 AM - 4:00 PM at (520) 456-1063.
Community Center	The community center is closed, and no private events will take place at this time. If you had a reservation, and paid a deposit please contact Town Hall during business hours for a refund.
Parks	All parks are still open however, please adhere to the CDC's guidelines for social distancing and limiting group size.
Landfill	The Town Landfill is still open and operating its normal hours.
Trash Service	Trash Pickup from Waste Management will continue its normal operations and pick- up schedules.
Public Works	Our Public Works Department is still active and monitoring the wells to ensure residents receive fresh water to their homes. Be advised that extra precautionary measures will be implemented when responding to calls for service

Police	Our Police Department is still operating and staffed to ensure the protection of our residents and visitors, with additional precautions being implemented to protect themselves and those they come in contact with.
