<u>Planning and Zoning Office News-</u> Monsoon season is here and already the weeds are growing fast. We would like to remind residents to regularly mow their properties. Residents are reminded that they are required to mow their portion of the alleyways per Town code. Please be sure that you mow the weeds and keep the area clean and safe.



<u>Town Council News</u>— The Town Council voted on June 9th 2022, to approve the tentative Town Budget for 2022/2023. They also voted to not raise property taxes for the upcoming fiscal year. The council meets in person every second and fourth Thursday of the month. The meeting starts at 6pm in Council Chambers at Town Hall. You can

attend in person or watch on Facebook Live on the town's Facebook page. Agendas are posted 24 hours in advance and may be found at Town Hall, the Library, the Post Office, the Police Station, and online at the town's website at https://huachucacityaz.gov.



<u>Public Safety Information –</u> We anticipate a good monsoon season, and as a reminder, make sure you follow all posted signs. People underestimate the force and power of water. Many of the deaths occur in cars swept downstream. The majority of these drownings are preventable. Never drive around the barriers blocking a flooded road. The road may have collapsed under that water. A mere six

inches of fast-moving flood water can knock over an adult. It takes just twelve inches of rushing water to carry away most cars and just two feet of rushing water can carry away SUVs and trucks. It is NEVER safe to drive or walk into flood waters.



Back to School Backpack Event/National Night Out– Registration is now open. Come into the library and fill out a form and your child can get a backpack stuffed full of school supplies for free! Backpacks will be picked up on our combined Back to School Event/National Night Out on Friday, July 29th from 6:00-7:30! Registration is limited to children who live in Huachuca City or attend a school in the Tombstone Unified School District.

<u>Animal Control News</u> – Per Town Code, all dogs over the age of 4 months must have a rabies vaccination and be registered with the Town of Huachuca City Animal Control Officer. You can arrange to get a rabies vaccination at a local veterinarian. When you are ready to get the license, come to the Huachuca City Police Department Monday to Friday, 9am to 4pm, or call 520-678-3582 to arrange a time to fill out paperwork and pay the fee. The Animal Control Officer can also offer the Parvo, Distemper, and Bordetella vaccines, as well as microchipping your pet. For associated costs, please contact the ACO at the above number.

If you see injured wildlife (i.e., coyote, skunks, bobcats, fox, ringtails), any deceased animals, or have questions please call SEACOM at 520-803-3550. For big game (i.e., deer, javelina, bear) or have questions, please call AZ Game and Fish at 623-236-7201.

<u>Fry Fire District</u> – Let's talk about legal fireworks in Arizona. The consumer fireworks that are legal in Arizona are ground and hand-held sparkling devices, cylindrical/cone fountains, illuminating torches, wheels and ground spinner, flitter sparklers, toy smoke devices, wire sparklets and dipped sticks. Any type of firework that explodes, shoots up or detonates in the air is illegal and can include sky or bottle rockets, firecrackers, and aerial fireworks.

If you do choose to use legal fireworks, remember some of these very important tips; never allow young children to handle fireworks, keep a distance of at least 50 feet from people, structures, and flammable materials, only light one device at a time, do not try to re-light or handle malfunctioning fireworks, never light fireworks indoors, and have a garden hose nearby to fully extinguish fireworks that don't go off or in case of fire.

<u>Library News</u> – We have been having a blast with our summer reading and summer splash programs! We have been making lots of crafts, conducting STEM experiments, talking about healthy foods and exercise, learning about water conservation, and of course reading! This year we joined in partnership with the Huachuca City Elementary School to host their summer school kids for some of our activities.
