The Town of Huachuca City is making customer service and engaging with our citizens a priority moving forward and we are excited to announce that we are partnering with <u>GOGov</u>, a government software company, to launch a new free mobile application for our city called Sunset City Connection! Residents will be able to submit service requests on the fly from their smartphones or on the web, and

access important city information regarding event, alerts and more. If a question arises, city workers will be able to have direct communication with residents to resolve issues together. Sunset City Connection will feature access to the following city resources: Submit requests/concerns with the easy access "Start Request" button, you can provide multiple photos when submitting a request, track requests and send messages to City Hall Staff regarding the status of a request, and access Frequently Asked Questions through the fully searchable knowledge base. To download the free app, go to the Apple App Store or Google Play Store and search "Sunset City Connection" to find the app.

<u>Fry Fire District</u> – When smoke alarms are working properly, it can mean the difference between life and death. Smoke alarms must be maintained properly and tested regularly to ensure their effectiveness. Fry Fire District are happy to announce that we have smoke alarms available for the residents of Huachuca City free of charge and with free installation. We encourage residents to keep themselves and their families safe by signing up for the Smoke Alarm Program, as well as creating an escape plan to further improve the odds of survival in a home fire. Police Department News - The Huachuca City Police Department would like to remind all of its citizens of the issues with fraud becoming more rampant. It is essential to stay informed and take actions to protect yourself and your family. Fraud and scams can come through the mail, email, text messages and phone calls. Here are some examples of commonly used schemes: 1) They claim there is a prize involved, example you won the lottery. 2) You receive an unexpected check or credit card that you didn't apply for. 3) You're asked to verify sensitive information over the phone. Remember, no bank, government agencies or reputable companies should call you and request any sensitive personal information over the phone. 4) You're threatened with severe consequences if you don't comply with the scammer, example jail time or a warrant will be placed for your arrest. 5) Emails or paper mail that does not look right. Never click on the email or reply to the sender. 6) If what the scammer is offering is "too good to be true", it probably is a scam. 7) You're asked to pay for something in advance, especially via an unusual payment method, like cryptocurrency, gift cards or money wires. As always if you believe you have fallen victim to a scam or have questions regarding a suspected scam contact your local Police Department to make a report or get advice.
