<u>Town Council News</u>– Effective 1 July, garbage fees increased. As a reminder, there is a \$2.00 monthly administrative billing fee for each account. These rates are based on a 7% increase from the CPI (Consumer Price Index). The new rates are:

Each Residential Unit (96 gallons) - increased from \$13.18 to \$14.10 monthly, 1 pickup per week

Rate for additional trash cans - increased from \$7.73 to \$8.27 monthly per can

Optional Roll-off service (Residential or Commercial) Roll-off Service Size 1 \$141.54 (does not include disposal) Roll-off Service Size 2 \$141.54 (does not include disposal) Roll-off Service Size 3 \$141.54 (does not include disposal) Roll-off Delivery Charge \$58.98 Disposal per ton roll-off \$41.28 per ton Note: Roll-off containers residentially are only allowed for up to 30 days, 3 times per year.

Landfill fees also increased with effect from 1 July. The new rates are: Commercial per ton \$59.00 Residential vehicle fee remains at \$10 up to 360 pounds of trash. However, over 360 pounds will be charged at \$59 per ton Dead animals/livestock \$59.00 per ton Charge Accounts fee \$59.00 per ton Special Commercial/Business rate (minimum 2,500 tons) \$38 per ton

Town Hall News – Starting August 1st, the Huachuca City Pool hours will be Saturdays and Sundays only, from 1pm-6pm. We will be open for Labor Day Weekend, September 2-4 from 1pm-6pm. The pool then

closes for the season. Admission is free until the end of the season.

<u>Fry Fire District</u> – Nationally, humans cause almost nine out of ten wildfires. These preventable wildfires threaten lives, property, and our precious natural resources. Whether you are a first-time visitor or a public land pro, you play a valuable role in preventing wildfires and protecting our communities. If you are off-roading, remember that your exhaust can reach temperatures of 1,000+ degrees. Avoid driving or parking over dry grass. Vehicles and equipment can shoot sparks from their exhaust, particularly vehicles that have not received regular maintenance, so remember to check your tires, bearings, and axles on your trailer. Weather conditions and local restrictions should guide your decision for any fire-related activity such as building a campfire, operating equipment, or off-roading.

Animal Control Cat Facts!

1) A cat's nose is as unique as a human fingerprint.

2) The only time cats meow to communicate with other felines is when they are kittens signaling their mother.

3) There are forty-four recognized breeds of cats.
