**Fry Fire District** – The theme for this year's Fire Prevention Week, October 8-14, 2023, is "Cooking safety starts with YOU! Pay attention to fire prevention!" According to the NFPA, unattended cooking is the leading cause of home cooking fires and related deaths. Here are some helpful tips; • Always keep a close eye on what you are cooking and set a timer to help monitor the cooking area. • Clear the cooking area of

combustible items and anything that can burn, such as dish towels, oven mitts, food packaging, and paper towels. • Turn pot handles toward the back of the stove. Keep a lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan and turn off the burner. • Create a "kid and pet free zone" of at least three feet around the cooking area and anywhere else hot food or drink is prepared or carried. <u>Animal Control Officer News</u> – Everyone loves fresh eggs but please remember that keeping chickens and ducks within the city limits is prohibited according to the town code, section 6.15.030. A) It is unlawful for any person to keep or cause to be kept any horses, mules, cattle, burros, goats, sheep, swine, geese, turkeys, chickens,

guinea hens, pigeons, rabbits, ducks or other livestock or poultry or fowl within the corporate limits of the town except on parcels of four acres or more. Keeping any of the above-mentioned animals will result in a citation and a fine, and you will need to relocate the animals. If you have any questions, call Animal Control at 520-456-1353. Police Department News- In partnership with the Tombstone Unified School District, Cpl. Jose Olivas of the HCPD will spearhead our new School Resource Officer (SRO) program for the Huachuca City School, thanks to a grant from the Legacy Foundation of Southeast Arizona. SROs were created in 1953 and are employed by local law enforcement agencies to collaborate closely with school administrators. SROs function as a visual deterrent to crime and to

people who wish to do harm, by creating a safe environment for students and staff.
