Appointments are recommended. The clinic takes most insurance and offers sliding scale fees for those without insurance. They can provide transportation from anywhere within town limits to the clinic. Call 520-459-3011 to make an appointment or to arrange for transportation, if needed. The Mobile Clinic will be parked in the Senior Center Parking lot.
