LANDFILL NEWS – The Huachuca City Landfill is not authorized to accept tires. The Cochise County Western Regional Landfill is the only waste tire collection site authorized by the state in our area. The county accepts up to 5 tires free per year per resident.

Residential Landfill customers are reminded to separate your metal goods and place them on the ground next to the residential roll off bins. Also, to prevent fires at our Landfill, please make sure when you are cleaning your fireplace or emptying your charcoal BBQ that there are no hot embers.
