Planning and Zoning Office News- We would like to apologize for any confusion regarding the use of alleyways in last month's newsletter. The alleyways are primarily used for the Town's Public Works department and utility companies service vehicles and equipment. However, residents are allowed to use the alleyways to have access to their rear or side yards as needed. Permanently parking a vehicle in the alleyway is prohibited as it blocks access for Public Works and utility vehicles.

Reminder! Monsoon season is coming up fast. We would like to remind residents to regularly mow their properties. Residents are reminded that they are required to mow their portion of the alleyways per Town code. Please be sure that you mow the weeds and keep the area clean and safe.

Town Hall News- All Town Offices, except for the Landfill, will be closed on Monday, June 20th in observance of the Juneteenth Holiday. Garbage pickup during the week of July 4th will be on Thursday July 7th.

Public Safety Information - Have you been wondering about the new blue reflectors you see on the streets? Here is the answer! The blue raised pavement markers, or RPMs, have been installed to assist first responders in locating fire hydrants, especially at night. They are not legally required but they are encouraged as a public safety supplement. You'll notice that they're located on the roadways in Huachuca City and are immediately adjacent to fire hydrants.



Huachuca City Public Pool – The Pool is OPEN for the summer. The hours are Thursdays & Fridays 12-6pm and Saturdays & Sundays 1pm-6pm. Costs are \$3 per day for adults, \$1 per day for children aged 4-17 and children under 3 are free! Seasonal swim passes for 2022 are available for purchase at the pool (cash only), the library (cash or card) and Town Hall (cash or card). Costs are \$50 for adult and \$20 for children aged 4-17.

The Town of Huachuca City is hiring a Solid Waste/Landfill Director

This position will manage all aspects of landfill operations for the Town of Huachuca City. Duties include budget development and administration, staff management, market expansion, and responsibility for daily operations. Supervises operators. Develops and carries out policies, procedures and programs as related to both daily and long-range management of the Landfill. Ensures compliance with federal, state, and local regulations. Also assures that staff is properly trained so that daily operations comply with permits, solid waste codes and Federal, State, Local, and Town policies and procedures. Minimum requirements: Bachelor's degree in environmental management or related field; supplemented by five years' experience that includes supervising staff and managing solid waste collection and disposal programs, or an equivalent combination of education, training, and experience. Veterans Memorial Wellness Park



Sunday May 22 was the first day of work on the Veterans Memorial Wellness Park. Fifteen soldiers from 2-13th Aviation Regiment based at Fort Huachuca volunteered to help under the supervision of Borderlands Restoration. The soldiers started with developing the labyrinth and the basins surrounding it by digging and placing dirt which will raise the labyrinth, and by picking out the rocks that will line the basins and will catch rainwater. The soldiers helped clean up the NW corner of the parking lot and started to create a dirt berm which will also collect rainwater that will support existing trees and vegetation and the new native plants which will be planted in another phase.
